Activities

Kindergarten/1st Grade

- Name a topic and have your child say all they can think of that relates to the topic. For example, if you say "farm," your child can say, "cow, tractor, crop, farmer...."

1st Grade/2nd Grade

- Play "Hot Potato" with words. Choose a word, and ask your child to think a word that has a similar meaning. For example, if you say, "gross," your child could say, "yucky". Take turns until neither person can think of another word. For added fun, use an object as the "hot potato" while you play or try opposite words.

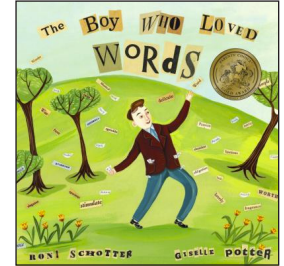
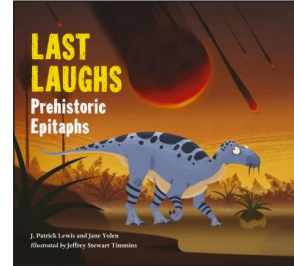
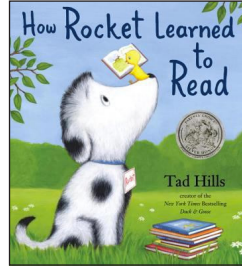
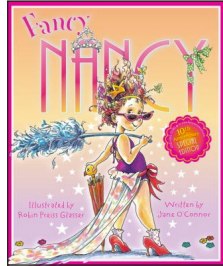
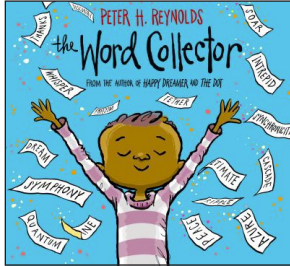
2nd Grade/3rd Grade

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Actividades

Kindergarten / 1er Grado

- Escoja un tema y haga que su hijo/a diga todo lo que se le ocurra que se relacione con el tema. Por ejemplo, si usted dice "granja", su hijo/a puede decir "vaca, tractor, cosecha, granjero..."

1er Grado / 2º Grado

- Juega a "patata caliente" con las palabras. Escoge una palabra, y pídale a su hijo que piense en una palabra que tenga un significado similar. por ejemplo, si dices, "asqueroso", su hijo podría decir, "sucio". Puedes dar turnos hasta que ninguna persona puede pensar en otra palabra. Para mayor diversión, usa un objeto como la "patata caliente" mientras juegas o intentas palabras opuestas.

2º / 3er Grado

- El juego "adivina mi palabra"—con una lista de vocabulario, déle a su hijo/a tres pistas para ayudarlo a adivinar la palabra escogida. Por ejemplo, al pensar en la palabra "peso," la primera pista podría ser "Se usa una balanza para medir esta palabra." Se puede cambiar de rol y hacer que su hijo/a le proporcione las pistas.
